

Isolation / Quarantine Protocols - Return to School

Farmington Valley Health District:



- Protocols when isolation or quarantine is required
- Guidance when a student or adult may return to the school building
- Typical and less typical symptoms and when the decision will be made for a student or adult to be dismissed
- Tracing ~ Notifications when a student / adult has symptoms / been exposed / tests positive and the next steps in those situations?

Survey Results



Total Responses: 702 / 845 (7/17/2020)

Parent / Guardian:

- 60% of families plan to send their child(ren) back for in-school learning
- 10% of families will not be sending their children back for in-school learning
- 29% of families are unsure

Transportation :

- 66% of families are willing and able to transport their child
- 34% of families plan to use the bus to transport their children to school

2020-2021 School Calendar



- CSDE has issued flexibility in the 180 day requirement for students and may be acted on by local Boards of Education. For the 2020-2021 school year; students are required to attend school for 177 days.
- The additional three days must be used prior to the start of the school year for the purposes including but not limited to:
 - additional training and professional development days to adjust to and educate on new requirements or policies related to health and safety in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic;
 - time for educators and staff to plan classroom set-up and consider changes to facilities required to maximize safety measures;
 - social-emotional services to staff, and training to prepare them to provide that support to students.

Transportation

Low Risk

- Up to full capacity
- All students must wear masks
- Disinfecting between cohorts
- Loading and unloading in controlled manner

Moderate Risk

Reduced capacity, students should be 6ft. apart unless from the same household

Drop Off and Pick Up

Revised procedures will be communicated by principals before the start of school.

Health and Safety



Social Distancing

- East Granby Public Schools will maximize space by arranging furniture as needed to maximize social distancing.
- Instructional strategies will be modified to support social distancing.
- Areas of large space will be repurposed to support teaching and learning with social distancing.

Masks

- Face covering for all students and staff are required by the Governor and the CSDE when inside the school building. The following are exceptions:
 - Anyone who has trouble breathing, or anyone who is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance, per CDC guidance.
 - Anyone who has a medical reason making it unsafe to wear a face covering

Health and Safety



- Hand Washing
 - Proper handwashing techniques will be reviewed with students at the start of school.
 - District is researching temporary hand washing stations to be placed in buildings where access to sinks are limited.

- Hand Sanitizer
 - The district has purchased hand sanitizer dispensers that will be mounted throughout the buildings.

Health and Safety



- Signage
 - The district will be posting signage upon entry and throughout each building
 - Wash hands / social distancing / masks
 - **■** Traffic patterns

- Material Sharing
 - Protocols will be developed to minimize multiple students sharing high touch materials to the extent possible

- Fire and Crisis Drills
 - Administrators are working under the guidance of fire and safety officials and will follow required and recommended practices

Cohorting and Hallway Traffic Flow



- Elementary students will remain with their classroom cohort throughout the day with multiple outdoor breaks and recesses, weather permitting. Specials will rotate a week at a time in cohort classrooms.
- Middle school students will remain with the same cohort throughout the day to the greatest extent possible.
- Given the range of courses and class requirements, East Granby High School will cluster grade level subjects together, to the greatest extent possible, to maximize social distancing for students.
- Hallway traffic will be designed to best maintain social distance.
- Locker protocols will be determined. Backpacks will be allowed in class.

Cleaning and Disinfecting



- Increased cleaning and disinfecting
 - Custodians will receive training that aligns with CDC guidelines
 - Bathrooms will be cleaned and disinfected two times a day while building is occupied.
 - All high touch hard surfaces to be cleaned and disinfected daily.
 - EGPS have purchased electrostatic sprayers to assist in disinfecting.
 - Classroom cleaning protocols being developed in alignment with CDC guidelines.

Lunch/Snack



- East Granby is a "brown bag" school system.
- The district will follow CDC guidelines limiting volunteers/visitors in the building. As an example: Student and PTO sponsored hot lunch offerings are temporarily suspended.
- Milk will be offered for sale.
- Elementary students will eat in classrooms.
- Middle School and High School students will eat in larger areas allowing for social distancing: gym / commons
- Vending machine and microwave use will be determined with guidance from FVHD

After School Activities



- Use of buildings and activities may be affected as a function of space limitations
 - Clubs and activities
 - Town use
 - Outside group rentals
- All groups using a school building must submit a plan of action demonstrating compliance with district Covid policies.
- The district will work with the after school care program held at Allgrove School

Learning Pathways



- There are three models for returning to school, as required by the state.
- EGPS has polled parents regarding distance learning (DL) and returning to the building in the fall. In addition, parent and community representatives are on the Reopening 2020 Committee for Curriculum.
- Similarly, faculty and students have given feedback on what was effective for teaching and learning from our spring experience.
- The district has added some online subscriptions and apps to its repertoire for the fall, from simplified logins to greater access to reading materials.
- Additional faculty and staff training will occur for possible future DL.
- We are examining various scheduling models for optimum participation.

Professional Development



- Faculty and staff will receive professional development (PD) on the following: signs and symptoms of COVID-19, standard public health protocols, hygiene practices, PPE usage, reporting illness
- Also, we will provide training focusing on the social-emotional well being of students and adults.
- Technology training for new programs will be made available for on-demand access, either through providers or in-house
- Time for additional training for distance learning PD is allotted in our plans
